China's fiscal decentralization has been praised as an important driver of its economic growth. Inter-jurisdictional competition has arguably incentivized officials to promote economic development. However, it has also been argued that this single-minded focus on growth may undermine other desirable policies, including centrally-mandated governance reforms. We show in this paper that cities with weaker revenue streams have been slower to implement new transparency requirements. Additional evidence points to a bifurcation in strategies. In fiscally strong cities, increased foreign investment leads to greater disclosure of pollution, suggesting a race to the top for cities hoping to become world class. In fiscally weak cities, foreign investment is associated with decreased disclosure, suggesting they aim to be pollution havens. Similarly, fiscally strong cities increase pollution disclosures if they are highly polluted, suggesting a motivation to clean up, while fiscally weak cities decrease disclosures.

Ink and Gold explores the stunning artistry of the esteemed Kano painters, the most enduring and influential school of painting in Japanese history. Established in the late fifteenth century, the Kano lineage of artists served as painters-in-attendance to Japan's powerful shoguns for four hundred years. The exhibition presents more than 120 works of art spanning the school's long and illustrious history, including large-scale, gold leaf folding screens and sliding doors as well as ink paintings, hanging scrolls, and folding fans. Ink and Gold is the first outside Japan—and the first anywhere since 1979—to so fully examine the Kano painters' legacy. Due to their light sensitivity, works in the exhibition will be presented in three rotations, offering multiple opportunities to experience the full depth, scope, and variety of the Kano painters' remarkable achievements. The rotation schedule is February 16–March 15, March 18–April 12, and April 15–May 10, 2015.

The 9th Kyujanggak Korean Studies Summer Workshop 2015

This summer the Kyujanggak Institute of Korean Studies will host its ninth summer workshop for Korean Studies. The workshop aims to give graduate students in Korean Studies or Korea-related subjects the opportunity to further their understanding on research trends in various fields of Korean Studies. It will take place from June 29 to July 10, 2015 at the Kyujanggak Institute for Korean Studies.

Morning lectures will cover research methods, trends, and approaches in 10 different fields: history of science, old documents, architecture, anthropology, religion, art, politics, history, modern literature, and law. There will be ample time for discussion, and on the last day students will have the opportunity to present their research project or other aspects of Korean studies that interest them. All classes and discussions will take place in Korean. In the afternoon, students can either take an introductory class for reading classical Korean texts composed in Hanmun or join a 4-week intensive advanced Hanmun class (see separate announcement). The course registration fee is 500 USD, but students can obtain a fee waiving grant, as well as travel support. Lunches are provided at no cost at one of the campus restaurants. To apply, please complete the online application, together with a reference letter from your academic advisor. If you are planning to attend both the summer school and the hanmun workshop, you need to file only one application, but indicate in the appropriate place that you will be attending both.

The 3rd Kyujanggak Hanmun Workshop 2015

The Kyujanggak Institute for Korean Studies will host its third one-month intensive Hanmun workshop this summer. This workshop is for graduate students or advanced undergraduate students, who have completed at least one year of classical Chinese course(s) and are interested in improving their reading comprehension of original texts. Since classes will be conducted in Korean, students should also have at least intermediate-level proficiency in Korean.

The workshop will last four weeks, from June 29 to July 23, 2015. Seminars will take place each week from Monday to Thursday and last 2.5 hours each; the seminars mainly focus on the students' translations of assigned texts. Therefore, in addition to class hours, students will spend at least 10 hrs a week for preparing and translating the assigned texts.

The course registration fee is 500 USD, but students can obtain a fee waiving grant as well as travel support. Lunches are provided free at one of the campus restaurants. Students need to provide clear evidence of basic Hanmun comprehension skills, preferably through a reference letter from their academic advisor or Hanmun instructor.
