

InterExchange Working Abroad - Teaching English in China - deadline to apply: May 30, 2013

Following an airport greeting and welcome dinner, you will spend your first four weeks participating in a Training & Orientation program in Beijing. This comprehensive program will include 108 hours of TEFL training on teaching methodology and practice. It also includes Mandarin lessons and cultural orientation, leadership training and access to social and cultural activities. Accommodations and meals are provided.

Social Science Research Council, Korean Studies Dissertation Workshop - deadline to apply: May 1, 2013

The 2013 workshop will take place Monday, July 1 through Friday, July 5 at the Asilomar Conference Center in Monterey, California, and will involve twelve students and four faculty.

This year's mentor faculty include **Jennifer Jihye Chun** (University of Toronto), **Robert Oppenheim** (University of Texas at Austin), **Serk-Bae Suh** (University of California at Irvine) and **Jun Yoo** (University of Hawaii at Manoa).

The workshop welcomes applications from students who have not yet begun fieldwork, who are currently in the field, and those who are in the process of writing their dissertations. In most cases, the SSRC will fully cover participants' travel, lodging and meals for the duration of the workshop. Limited funds are available for participants traveling from outside the United States. Funding for the program is provided by the Korea Foundation.

Eligibility and Application

- Full-time advanced graduate students, regardless of citizenship, who are enrolled at US or Canadian institutions are eligible for the workshop.
- Applicants must have an approved dissertation prospectus at the time of application, but cannot have completed writing for final submission.
- Special consideration will be given to students from universities that are not major Korean Studies institutions.

A narrative description of the dissertation topic, short application form and a letter of recommendation from the student's primary advisor are required as part of the application.

Peking University Summer Chinese Language Program - deadline to apply: May 15, 2013

CLERC has been working with Peking University, the most prestigious university in China, for 19 years on the summer Chinese Language program. With strong cooperation and consistent improvements of both sides, this program has grown to be one of the most popular summer programs for U.S. college students.

2013 Peking University Summer Chinese Language Program is a six week intensive Mandarin Chinese learning program, designed for college students or working professionals who wish to learn Chinese in its local culture. Students are divided into three levels of classes for intensive language training: Elementary, Intermediate and Advanced. The American Association for Chinese Studies (AACS) annual conference program committee invites proposals for panels, roundtables, and papers concerning China, Hong Kong, Taiwan, and the Chinese diaspora for the 55th Annual Conference, hosted by Rutgers University in New Brunswick, NJ, October 11-13, 2013. We especially want to invite panel or paper proposals dealing with the change of leadership in China and its effects on the Chinese society, politics and economy, and its relationships with the United States, Taiwan, and the rest of the world.

The AACS is an interdisciplinary association devoted to the study of China broadly defined. Submissions from all disciplines are welcome. Membership in AACS is required for participation in the annual conference, and non-members are welcome to submit proposals, join the Association and participate in the annual conference. The program committee prefers proposals for complete panels (a chair, 2-3 papers, and 1-2 discussants) and roundtables (a chair and 3-4 other participants). The committee also welcomes proposals for individual papers and will attempt to place them on appropriate panels. Panels and roundtables concerning special events or topics of broad significance are welcome. Overall, our goal is to construct a **balanced** program, including panels representing the **humanities**, **social sciences**, **education and business-related disciplines**.

Our keynote speaker, **Jerome Cohen**, has been the driving force behind East Asian legal studies in the United States for nearly five decades. He has been a professor of law at New York University

(1990-present), Harvard University ('64-'79), and the University of California, Berkeley ('59-'64). Professor Cohen is a leading promoter of human rights and the rule of law in East Asia, meting out criticism and advice with an unbiased hand and helping both nations and individuals find their way to justice. Most recently, he played a key role in securing the freedom of Chinese human rights activist Chen Guangcheng, whose flight to the U.S. embassy in Beijing made headlines last spring.

Members of the program committee include John Fuh-sheng Hsieh (University of South Carolina), Linda H. Chiang (Azusa Pacific University), and Jacques DeLisle (University of Pennsylvania). Proposals should include the names and roles of panel/roundtable participants, contact information, paper topics and short abstracts.
