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The University of Pennsylvania is delighted to announce the seventh year of its summer STARTALK Penn High School Chinese Academy. Aimed at high school students in all grades, this intensive Chinese language program couples Penn's internationally known Chinese language and studies programs with its extensive experience in intellectual development programs for high school students.

The Chinese Academy will run for five weeks, from **July 1 to August 2, 2013**. Beginning Chinese I and II will be offered. Classes will be held from 9:00am to 3:00pm Monday through Thursday, and 9:00am-12:00pm on Friday. The program has places for 25 high school students, each of whom will be granted a **scholarship of \$1,200** to be applied to the \$2,000; the final tuition for each student will be \$800. We hope that you will bring this exciting program to the attention of your students.

Applications are reviewed and accepted on an ongoing basis, so interested students should apply as early as possible, before the **deadline of May 17, 2013**.

Did the destruction of the Big Buddha statues in the Bamiyan mark the end of archaeology in Afghanistan? Can war and archaeology co-exist?

In this lecture, Dr. Philippe Marquis, director of DAFA (Délégation Archéologique Française en Afghanistan), will first give us an overview on the archaeological activities in Afghanistan since the destruction of the Buddhist statues in Bamiyan by the Taliban in March 2003. He will then focus on the international salvage excavations of the extensive Buddhist monasteries at Mes Aynak, which are about to be cleared away for mining activities at the world's second largest copper mine.

Panelists will trace how the Korean community in China has evolved since China and South Korea formally established diplomatic relations in 1992. Panels include: "The Korean Community in Yanbian, PRC," "Identity, Diaspora & the Homeland," and "Trends in Urbanization in the PRC." This lecture will first sketch a Confucian perspective for analyzing the root *moral* causes for the increasing inequality, decline of democracy, and failure to achieve social justice in the U.S., and then go on to provide an alternative to the view that lies at the heart of our malaise, namely, that human beings are fundamentally free, autonomous and self-interested individuals.

Henry Rosemont is known internationally as an expert on East Asian philosophy; his work explores Confucian perspectives on notions of freedom, human rights, and equality. He has most recently been distinguished visiting professor of East Asian and Religious Studies at Brown University. The U.S. Department of Education and the International and Foreign Language Education (IFLE) office is pleased to announce a Fulbright-Hays Group Projects Abroad Program opportunity.

Under the Fulbright-Hays Group Projects Abroad (GPA) Program, the funds will support overseas projects in training, research, and curriculum development in modern foreign languages and area studies for teachers, students, and faculty engaged in a common endeavor. Projects may include short-term seminars, curriculum development, or group research/study.

Duration: Applicants may apply for a maximum grant performance period up to eighteen months in duration for short-term projects; proposed start and end dates should be September 1, 2013-March 31, 2015. Educator groups may travel abroad anytime during this eighteen month period. The minimum time abroad is four weeks total.

Eligible Applicants: (1) IHEs, (2) State departments of education, (3) Private nonprofit educational organizations, and (4) Consortia of these entities.

Eligible Participants: An individual is eligible to participate in a Fulbright-Hays GPA Short Term Project if she/he is: (1) A citizen, national, or permanent resident of the United States; and Currently employed full-time in a United States school system, institution of higher education, local education agency or state education agency (not applicable to students); (2) And at least one of the following: a) A teacher in an elementary or secondary school (please see note below); b) A faculty member who teaches modern foreign languages or area studies; c) An experienced education administrator responsible for planning, conducting, or supervising programs in modern foreign languages or area studies at the elementary, secondary, or postsecondary levels; d) A graduate student or junior or senior in an institution of higher education, who is a prospective teacher in the areas of social sciences, humanities and foreign languages. The student should meet the provisions set by his or her local and state education agencies.
